Favourite Music Genre? Rock


Favourite Sport and Team? *Soccer & West Ham Utd*

- 3. Enter your surname and Date of Birth (If it can not find you please contact LIWA as your date of birth may be incorrect in our system)
- 4. Select Individual Membership \$132.
- 5. On second page complete all your up to date information
- 6. If YOU are paying, select Me in the Who is LIWA Billing? field or select employer if work is paying
 - a. You will need a PO number or at least billing information for us to send an invoice.
- 7. You can either upload a profile photo but not compulsory
- 8. Fill in the the rest of the fields to complete application
- 9. *Important to Note**. It will send you an invoice in your name, If you are paying then this is your invoice for payment, if you selected Employer to bill, I will reconcile your invoice (this is just for your records) and I will send your employer an invoice in their name.
