As an Industry Peak Body our planning for events to support our members were with more certainty and has assisted in meeting our objectives for the past 12 months.

The organisation with nearly 700 individual members and 35 corporate memberships is in a strong financial and sustainable position. With 130 group one facilities across Western Australia owned by local and state governments providing the majority of work opportunities for the member cohort.

Engagement to help shape LIWA events has been a key factor in all our planning. We continue to engage with our Partners and Sponsors to be supporting the LIWA membership, and Inclusive with other key stakeholders to assist in strengthening the Industry.

I would like to acknowledge the Board comprising of Sarahjayne Westberg (Vice President), Billy Vibart (Secretary), Duncan Hutton (Treasurer), Peter Leaversuch, Melissa Warren, Dan Barber and Alex Baxter who all work tirelessly in these roles. The collective experience this group brings with current operations for large and small aquatic facilities, living and working in regional areas (3 of 8 Board Directors), industry experience and combined with passion for their local communities. On top of family and work commitments, the voluntary contributions you all make are greatly appreciated.

With a very small staff base comprising of Steve Good, Executive Officer and Caitlin Oxlade, Administration Officer, I recognise that the workflows change with the events and objectives from the board. Thank you to you both, for your dedication and enthusiasm to continue improvement in our service deliveries. The changes and the quality have been well received and noted in all LIWA events of recent.

The 2nd WA Aquatic and Recreation Industry Awards held at the Hyatt Regency Perth was a celebration of the high calibre of achievements for individuals and facilities across Western Australia.

Leanne Coverley-Brandis was a very deserving recipient of the Smith Robinson Award 2023 which recognises the over 30 years of achievements Leanne has had in many roles.

As with the State Conference, LIWA Aquatics recognises the importance of the swim schools and the work swim teachers across the state play in learn to swim programs assisting the reduction in risk as more children get these opportunities to play and enjoy swimming pools and any other water pursuits.

PRESIDENTS REPORT

In its second year at the Perth Convention and Exhibition Centre the LIWA Aquatics Annual State conference now rebranded as the WA Aquatic Recreation Conference was well accepted with over 360 delegates for the two-day event. The North West Regional event in Broome in May 2023 and the Albany and Kulin Seminars both in October 2022 had strong attendances. As key deliveries the success of these events for all attending in networking and sharing ideas is our objective.

Rebuilds and new projects in WA continue to be shaping the future of the Industry. With Terry Tyzack, Bayswater Waves and Active Midland all reopening in the next few months, after significant renewal projects will be placing supply and demand constraints on staffing structures. With this also comes opportunities.

Booragoon Fit and Aqua Jetty are commencing tendering for significant renewals and Ellenbrook and Alkimos facilities continue to progress their planning needs. Regionally projects continue to progress including the Oasis in Kalgoorlie and other new facility opening such as Kellerberrin and Coorow.

I predict that next 12 months for the Aquatic Industry in Western Australia will be a busy and growing phase. In addition to facilities reopening the warmer weather is predicted for a hot summer across the state allowing more Western Australians to get out to their local pool more often.
