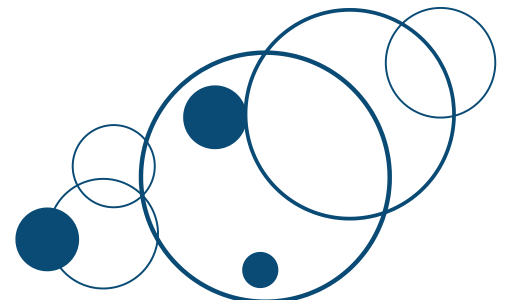

Albany Regional Seminar 2022

With a three year absence of visiting the southern regions of WA due to COVID, it was great to get back to meeting face to face again with our industries southern regional members. So it was on the road to Albany. The event was held at a new venue of the Retrovision Stadium located just a couple of minutes from the Albany Leisure and Aquatic Centre.

City of Albany Mayor Dennis Wellington welcoming members to Albany and officially opening the Seminar. This was followed by CEO of Royal Life Saving WA Peter Leaversuch come down to provide a sneak peak of the latest Bigger, Better, Safer Report due to be released later in October. Peter was able to provide invaluable information about the great southern regions as to how the region is doing statistically and the great work these facilities and the staff have done.

Tom Scott-Jones who now runs the Watch Around Program for RLSSWA, provided the attendees an opportunity to discuss the WAW program from a regional perspective, what works, what doesn't so that the program can be reviewed and improved to ensure the programs continued success.



The attendees then had an opportunity for a site visit to the newly renovated Albany Leisure and Aquatics Centre. With many changes that have happened over recent years there was a lot to look at. The group was split into two with one group touring the dry side facilities such as upgraded Gym to the impressive 2 multi-functional sports halls. Group 2 were taken on a tour of the aquatic facility and plantroom operations then both groups swapped so that they had tour of the entire facility.

After lunch, was a presentation from special guest RJ Houston from Royal Life Saving Australia. RJ is the National Manager of Aquatics for RLSSA and the chair for the National Aquatics Industry Committee.

RJ provided an up-to-date overview of the aquatics industry, and insights to how regional pool managers and aquatic facilities fit into this system and the importance of what you do for the communities. RJ provided some information from the recent Social Value report and what social impacts has on patrons who visit our facilities.

It was a very successful seminar. Thank you to John and Chris from the Albany Leisure and Aquatic Centre for all of there help and assistance in hosting the event.



Kulin Regional Seminar 2022

It had been 10 years since LIWA Aquatics last visited Kulin in 2012 for the re-opening of the refurbished Aquatic centre. Kulin Aquatic Centre is renowned for the biggest waterslide in regional WA (182 metres long and 18 metres high) which attracts many surrounding locals and tourists of WA during the summer months.

The 26th Annual Regional Seminar was held on 27th October with 30 registered delegates from around the regions attending for a day of networking and collaboration.

The day started with introductions and a review of the State of the Industry report by LIWA Aquatics President Nick Wilkinson.

Membership vs. Accreditation

LIWA Aquatics is often asked questions about the aquatic industry, but one of the most common questions or misunderstandings is about Membership and Accreditation.

A LIWA membership (Individual Membership) is a fee that is paid either annually or can be paid for a 3-year period. By being a member of LIWA Aquatics is that you get discounted rates at LIWA events such as Conferences and Seminars. e-News, Aquatic Recreation Journal, industry representation by LIWA Aquatics as the Peak Body, and **FREE processing of your Accreditation Renewal**.

Accreditation is a requirement of the Health Department of WA Code of Practice that all Aquatic Technical Operators (Duty Managers/Supervisors/Aquatic Managers) of Group 1 pools **MUST** hold accreditation which is issued by LIWA Aquatics. Accreditation is a certification that is given to people who have completed the criteria of accreditation. Accreditation is issued for a 3-year period. As part of being a LIWA Member you can renew your accreditation for **FREE**.

You need to complete 2 PD sessions in a 3-year period. You will need to provide certificate evidence for your PD if it has been done with a third party (examples could be a SCBA, Fire Warden Course or Chemical Handling etc). Pool Lifeguard and First Aid are **NOT** considered PD as they are mandatory requirements. PD has to relate to your role as an **Aquatic Technical Operator**.

One of the biggest misconceptions about accreditation is that members think that their accreditation is **automatically** renewed if they attend LIWA conferences and seminars. This is **NOT True**. If you are unsure if your membership has expired or if your accreditation is due for renewal please log into your account here www.liwaaquatics.org.au/login

Watch Around Water

The Watch Around Water program has been critical for ensuring that public swimming pools in WA remain safe for the community. The program provides a number of benefits including

- Contributing to overall safety of the centre
 - Supports staff to promote supervision messages
 - Reducing drowning and aquatic injuries
 - Provides a clear and consistent message about safety to the community and enforces that it is everyone's responsibility to promote Watch Around Water, from reception staff to lifeguards and swim school staff.
- There are a number of resources available for pools to help promote the Watch Around Water message to the community.
