



President's Report

WA Aquatic Recreation industry is ramping up with seasonal pools reopening or well into the preparation for reopening. Vac Swim lessons are in full swing with 1000s of Western Australian kids swimming again. I recognise that for some children they haven't been in the water for over 12 months. As we lead into summer the confidence and increased skills levels is extremely important.

For the Aquatic Centres holding these series of lessons with the Education Department, this is a dress rehearsal for summer peak attendances with the spike in aquatic patrons. This year the significant test on COVID plans with WA still in phase 4 restrictions an additional requirement for the management of the facilities.

2020 LIWA Aquatics AGM was held on Wednesday 23 September. Not held within the State Conference it was significant that we held our first AGM with Zoom (online meetings) option. Another opportunity for regional members to attend a live stream.

Congratulations to Ryan Scally, Sarahjayne Whiteley, Wendy Cole, Grace Darby who all re-nominated for the board. The 3 ladies on our board are hardworking and committed to making a difference across our sector, they also are the 37% of female representation on the board. Changes set with WA Governments future funding through Local Government Sport and Cultural Industries will require boards to be a 50% gender balance to ensure funding. Without a diverse board of not having people with different skill sets we are less likely to represent our members across WA with new ideas and shared experiences to support our Industry.

Thank you to Liew Withers who has stepped down after 4 years on the board and over 15 years as a valued part of developing the Aquatic Code of Practice in WA.

In July the LIWA Board commenced a review with Local Government Sport and Cultural Industries for the purpose of strengthen our governance and understanding the benchmarking with other sports bodies. Key outcomes include a strong financial basis within the organisation and improvements identified in shaping the next forward plan from 2021. This will include reviewing all policies, procedures and succession planning for key roles within the organisation. The identified improvements will over the next 10 months support filling vacancies on the board including recognising filling board skill set gaps, gender equality and regional members on the board.

I recognise the Trainees who have completed with Royal Life Saving over the last 12 months, their Certificate II in Sport and Recreation. This has included school based trainees introduced this year. These opportunities for younger people to be introduced into the industry in leadership roles are vitally important for the industry. Looking forward to catching up with a lot of you at the WA Regional Aquatic Recreation Seminar in Northam next week.



What do I do?

I have been trained throughout the year as a Centre Assistant, went through and completed my Pool Lifeguard course through Royal Life Saving, and have just started my progression into Pool Operations by going on the Group 1 Pool Operations course also through Royal Lifesaving and the City of Canning.

Day to Day there are always new things to learn or do at both centres from following Duty Officers around whilst they complete their duties to fixing, maintaining and cleaning things around the centre. During my time as a Trainee, I have learnt that to do well in the role you must listen and learn but also take charge of your own learning at times. Don't be lazy and take initiative.

As my role is full time, my roster is split between lifeguarding, centre assistant work and what is referred to as admin work (study time, maintenance and shadowing the Duty Officer).

The work environment through both leisure facilities inside the City of Canning is extremely welcoming and energetic. You will never be bored as there are always things to do. Some things that have stood out to me during the traineeships would be obtaining my lifeguard qualification and progressing through to hopefully move into pool operations in the near future. This traineeship has helped introduce me to an industry I knew next to nothing about. It has shown me how big the aquatic recreation community is and how amazing it is to get hands on behind the scenes of your local pool. And trust me a lot happens!
