I reflected while on a long drive from Exmouth to Perth in the July school holidays what I had experienced in the last four months. A roller coaster journey with constant changes on our ability to manage Aquatic Facilities in a pandemic, limited information ever changing and a high expectation to support others with limited work opportunities. I have closed facilities before but not with 3 hours' notice and certainly without such devastating effects to job prospects and livelihood. While Western Australia is still not without uncertainty, the rebound to closures in March is showing many silver linings for our industry.

Phase 3 lifting of restrictions has allowed all year round facilities to reopen and indications from conversations with industry colleagues is business is returning. Education Department term 3 lessons have started and memberships in some facilities have indicated potential growth with new appreciations for fitness. In general we are cleaner and improvements made. A number of facilities completed major shutdowns.

With the decision to not hold the Annual State Conference, LIWA Aquatics has been working with using technology to continue linking our members. The "Zoom around the pools" online chat sessions for group conversations on key topics commenced in June. They have been attended with up to 30 people and have endeavoured to meet current discussions through the lifting of restrictions. Every session I have attended has provided me some good learnings that I have then used in my workplace.

Congratulations to Steve Good for the introduction of Zoom around the pools and the work he has done to meet with stakeholders including WA Health Department and other key partners during this time.

LIWA Webinars have commenced and these are leading to member's accreditation for the future. I encourage you to attend these events and also give feedback on their value. I look forward to Gihan Perera's session on Friday 14th August - Future Focus: Planning and Leadership in an Uncertain Future.

I also look forward to the Regional Seminar on October 7 at the Northam Aquatic Centre. I invite you if you have the opportunity to join us for this event. Places are limited so book online through the LIWA Website today.

Western Australians are getting encouraged where possible to travel to and spend holiday dollars in regional WA. For many pools I know that the links to tourism is already established through your Shires. An opportunity in metro as well as Sandgropers all across the state to consider their future holidays possibly in Perth.

The Western Australian Government announced on 2 August \$130 million for sporting infrastructure projects. This includes projects in the Aquatic Industry indicating new facilities in Perth with the WACA Ground and at Alkimos. Stage 2 at Aqua Jetty in Rockingham and major upgrades at both HBF Stadium and HBF Arena and a water playground at Kununurra Leisure Centre.

NATIONAL AQUATIC INDUSTRY WORKFORCE REPORT

A new National Aquatic Industry Report, published by Royal Life Saving on behalf of the National Aquatic Industry Safety Committee (NAISC), comes at critical and challenging time for the aquatic industry, which has been significantly impacted by Australia-wide closures following the COVID-19 Pandemic. The Pandemic has led to a loss of employment, or a significant reduction in hours, for many of the 67,000 frontline workers, of which almost half are casual employees, three-quarters are female and 40% are between the ages of 18 to 24 years. The sector faces an estimated \$900m in lost revenue and \$430m in lost wages in the six months to September 2020. The report analyses employee insights relating to working life, professional development and future needs of those working in the aquatic industry, a sector which contributes directly to community health, wellbeing and safety, and is thought to provide \$2.8 billion in health benefits each year.
